Even classified as Lithium metal batteries (UN3090), 2021 IATA Dangerous Goods Regulations 62nd edition Packing Instruction 968 Section II is applied. The product is handled as Non-Dangerous Goods by meeting the following requirements.(1)

Lithium metal cells and batteries offered for transport are not subject to other additional requirements of the UN Regulations if they meet the following(1)(3)

1. for cells, the mass of lithium is not more than 1.0 gram
2. for batteries, the aggregate mass of lithium is not more than 2.0 grams
3. each cell or battery is of the type proven to meet the requirements of each test in the UN Manual of Tests and Criteria Part III subsection 38.3.
